Summer Study Program Studies in Traditional Italian Culture Cinque Terre & Levanto, Italy

This program gives you the chance to spend an unforgettable summer study program studying traditional Italian culture in an environment that lends itself to experiential learning and inspiration in one of the most beautiful places on Earth: the Cinque Terre.

The program is designed to be an introduction into one facet of Italian culture, and is available to students of all academic backgrounds who are interested in Italy, traditional cultures, history, and the Mediterranean.

While the course focuses on traditional forms of culture, you will also have the opportunity to dive into other, more contemporary aspects of Italian life simply through the experience of studying abroad. You will live in shared, fully-furnished apartments in the very lively town of Levanto, built up around a natural harbor and just 4 minutes by train from the first town of the Cinque Terre. You will partake in 8 hours of Survival Italian lessons which will make you more comfortable and savvy during your summer studies. And the program also offers three tours during your stay: a hiking tour of the Cinque Terre, a marine excursion through the protected waters along the coast in a large traditional Ligurian wooden boat, and a day in the extraordinarily beautiful and historically-important city of Genoa.

This course offers 3 university credits.
